#### **Ableism in Academia**

30 March • Online (<u>Teams Room 4</u>) • 11:30 - 12:20

Join a panel of PGRs to learn more about systemic ableism in academia, the impact this has on research and ideas to improve inclusivity. Nathan Bramald will open the session to explain ableism and how it manifests within academia, drawing on his experiences as coordinator of the Student Disability Network at the University of Huddersfield SU. Mary Anderson will draw on her PhD research about physically disabled students' experiences within higher education (HE), and exploring ableism and disablism in a HE context. Lastly, Louisa Peters will discuss her paper on the experiences of neurodiverse PGRs and the difference between making surface level and systemic changes to academia.
